#### GIVE YOUR CHILD A SOUND CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

As you know, education is, in reality, a parent responsibility. During the past few generations this responsibility has been turned over to a secular State; our public educational system has become humanistic and materialistic in its nature, and is inconsistent with our Christian philosophy of life.

For several years, STOP & CARE have been investigating various ways of ensuring that school-age children of Christian parents may receive a sound education that is God honouring. Our investigations have led us to a programme of learning based on a Biblical philosophy, individually prescribed self-instructional curriculum, and an advanced system of motivated learning. This educational programme, available from Accelerated Christian Education (A.C.E.) is designed so that it will not be financially prohibitive. It will provide character training for children on a full-time basis and an academic education for school-age and postschool-age students, at least equal or superior to that of government education.

To meet the challenge of Christian education, STOP & CARE have formed a subsidiary - A.C.T.S. (ASSOCIATION FOR COMMUNITY TUTORIAL SERVICES) whose aim is to establish and underwrite the establishment costs of centres of Christian learning using the A.C.E. programme. Each centre should readily become financially viable in its own right. The first ACTS-sponsored academy will open in Woody Point on 1st February, 1983 to meet the educational needs of students locally in a Christ-centred environment, with dedicated Christian supervisors in a spiritual atmosphere. Details regarding the Woody Point Community Academy and forms relative to the commencement of the Academy for completion by interested people comprise the bulk of this STOP PRESS.

The Peninsula will soon have an independent academy for primary and secondary students.

The academy, to be known as the Woody Foint Community Academy, will begin operatons on February 1.

It will be an independent academy on an interdemoninational basis with a Christian curriculum.

The academy will be run by the Association for Community Tutorial Services, which was formed in October last year by parents interested in the community.

A spol:esman for the association said the academy would provide tutors for full-time students and also for students requiring coaching.

"There will even be a little tertiary tuition available in different areas such as computer programming," the spokesman said.

Hours of the academy will be from 8 a.m. till 6 p.m.

The spokesman said the academy was concerned about the unemployment situation and decided to extend the hours to aid other people.

"We are keen to aid people who are unable to get a job they wish because of a lack of a particular skill.

Intake would be limited to 50 or 60 full-time students, but the spokesman said the association was prepared to expand.

A public meeting will be held this Friday night at the Humpybong Yacht Club, Woody Point, starting at 7 30 pm

Slides, showing the type of schooling and planned programming, will be presented and questions on the academy will be answered.



## Viewpoint by Bill Barnes of Brisbane Christian Fellowship How do we find rest??? SUBURBAN EXPRESS, Thursday, January

I wonder how many New Year resolutions were made to try to find a greater rest or peace in the midst of 1983? The more we strive to find that peace, the further it appears to be away from

The Bible makes it quite clear to us that there is NO real rest or peace outside of our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus is recorded in Matthew 11:28&29 as saying "Come unto Me all who are weary and heavy lader, and I WILL GIVE YOU REST. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you shall find rest for your souls."

There appears to be a contradiction in this statement of our Lords. First He tells us to come to Him and He will give us REST, but then He talks about taking His yoke which speaks of work. particularly when we consider how they are used on a bullock team. But what Jesus was saying is that His REST does not mean idleness or escape from reality, but the continuing to live in this world yoked to Him - the head bullock if you like. The head bullock in a bullock team is the one who takes the main strain and sets the direction for the others.

It's as we learn to depend on Jesus in every area of our lives and commit all our anxieties and worries over to Him, that we experience His rest and peace. Our lives need to be yoked to Him, but they need to be yoked also to our brothers and sisters in the Lord in the midst of His Body. For as a bullock team pulls together with one objective and in one direction so we are to be in His chutch. Hebrews 10:24&25 tells us to encourage one another to assemble together as we see the DAY of the Lord drawing near - This is such a time.

So that the student's academic progress does not cause financial strains upon the home, the cost of PACEs will be met by the academy. Only a REPEAT PACE in any subject will incur an extra charge.

PLEASE ENQUIRE ABOUT TUITION FEES ASSISTANCE PLANS.

NOTE: The academic year is 40 weeks, and there are four terms in the year. There are no fees payable in January or December.
